

Paramedic Program Expense Fact Sheet


- Based on midyear projections, County staff estimates the cost of the Paramedic program will be \$219,000 higher than the budgeted \$1.84 Million for the current fiscal year. Staff has asked the Board to approve a \$229,000 transfer from reserves or a cut in services to county residents/visitors.
- One proposed service reduction is to eliminate two teams (Medic 2 in June Lake and Medic 1 in Walker/Coleville) for one third of the time. This would result in up to a 45 minute delay in emergency response from the next closest station to those communities on those days.
- The current shortfall is a direct result of a 31% reduction in the program's budget from the previous fiscal year. Revenue from the program has never been higher. General Fund costs of the program for last fiscal year and this fiscal year (projected) are the two lowest cost years since 2008/09 fiscal year.
- Reducing services makes little sense, given the program has significantly reduced expenses and
 increased revenues over the past two fiscal years. Service cuts make even less sense in light of
 automatic budget cuts that will go into effect in just a few months. Under the current labor contract, any
 increase in expenses over budget will trigger automatic, dollar-for-dollar, cuts to Paramedic wages and
 benefits starting on July 1, 2015.
- EMS salary and wages are estimated to be \$163,429 over budget. County staff indicates this is due to unrealized savings from the MOU and that these savings will not be realized until the third year of the MOU. However, per the MOU, any shortfall in the budget will trigger automatic cuts July 1, 2015. The county valued the first trigger cut (loss of comp time accrual) at \$205,188 alone. Total value of all wage and benefit cuts is more than three times the estimated shortfall, which ensures that the County will be able to adjust expenses below budget on July 1.
- Salary and wages are also higher than anticipated due to transfer charges from budget item # 100-42855-21100 that the bargaining unit was unaware of during negotiation of the MOU. Approximately \$100,000 in salary and benefits from both the Public Health and Finance departments is currently being charged to the EMS budget and these transfer charges make up nearly 2/3 of the projected overage.
- While overtime is projected to exceed the current budget, it has been cut nearly in half from its high two years ago, and is \$40,000 lower than fiscal year 2007/08 which had the lowest overall overtime expenses among recent years. Again, per the MOU, any budget overage will be offset by automatically triggered cuts on July 1.
- The Paramedic program had revenues of \$1.4 Million in 2013/14, resulting in a net General Fund cost of just under \$2 Million. Projected revenues for 2014/15 are an all-time high of \$1.76 Million. While expenses have also increased, the projected net General Fund cost is only \$120,000 more than the 2013/14 net cost of the program.
- Net General Fund actual cost for the Paramedic program was \$2.9 Million in 2012/13. For 2013/14, budgeted net cost was decreased to \$2.6 Million. The program finished the year more than \$700,000 under this reduced budget. The majority of savings were due to changes imposed in 2013 and due to multiple vacancies in the department during that fiscal year. This year's targeted General Fund cost of \$1.84 Million is a 37% reduction from the actual contribution of \$2.92 Million, only two years ago in 2012/13.
- The Paramedic program has achieved the above cost savings over the last two years through the following changes:
 - Abandoning the past practice of staffing each ambulance with two paramedics, and replacing retiring paramedics with EMT's, who are paid less due to their lower level of training.
 - Hiring a pool of part time EMT's to be used when full time employees take a day off, in order to reduce overtime expenses.
 - o Increasing the share each employee pays for medical insurance premiums.
 - Eliminating the majority of fire/rescue training, and prohibiting EMS staff from assisting volunteer fire departments with rescue duties unless the employees had obtained training on their own time.

Mono County Paramedic Program 2009/10-2014/15 Budget Comparison


Budget vs. Actual Net General Fund Contribution




Budget vs. Actual Revenue




Budget vs. Actual Expenditures
