









Positive Lab Confirmed Results by Day for the Past 60 Days (Public)




TOTAL POSITIVE CASES (PCR CONF): 2904 POSITIVITY RATE: 17.4%/ CASE RATE/100,000: 46.0

CDPH MASK MANDATE UPDATE

California will lift mask mandate for vaccinated residents in indoor public places next week

Masks will still be required for unvaccinated residents indoors and for everyone in select settings such as in hospitals and nursing homes or while aboard public transit.

SAN FRANCISCO — With the Omicron coronavirus surge rapidly receding, California will lift its universal mask mandate for indoor public places next week, state officials announced Monday.

- Effective February 16th
- Masks remain required indoors for unvaccinated individuals, and for everyone in select settings, regardless of vaccination status, including:
 - Skilled Nursing Facilities
 - Public Transit
- Applies to counties without local mask Orders.
- Does not apply to K-12 schools.

MEGA-EVENTS

- Effective February 16th
- Increased attendance thresholds for indoor and outdoor mega-events
- 500 1,000 Indoor
- 5,000 10,000 Outdoor
- Attending mega-events Requires proof of vaccination or a negative PCR tests 2 days of the event or a negative antigen test 1 day of the event

HOSPITAL STATUS

- No COVID-19 related hospitalization currently
- Difficulty transferring patients
- Seeing manyski-relatedd injuries and multiple
 COVID-19 cases daily
- Staffing shortage
