1. Call to order.

Chair McQuilkin called the meeting to order at 10:03am.

- 2. Introductions and announcements Welcome to new Commissioner Florene Trainor.
 Chair McQuilkin welcomed new Commissioner Trainor, owner of Flo's Diner in Chalfant Valley, former Caltrans Public Information Officer, and Chalfant Valley/Eastern Sierra resident for over 30 years.
 Commissioners McQuilkin, Walsh, Wells, Trainor, Burkard, Morrison

- 3. Opportunity for the public to address the commission on items of interest of the public which are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Commission. Speakers may be limited in speaking time depending upon the press of business and number of persons wishing to address the Commission. No public comment.
- 4. Findings Relating to the Holding of Remote Meetings Under AB 361

Find that: (1) The Proclamation of State of Emergency issued by Governor Newsom on March 4, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic remains in effect; (2) Local Public Health Officials have recommended measures to promote social distancing; and (3) As a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees. Accordingly, meetings of the Economic Development, Tourism, and Film Commission may be held remotely in accordance with the requirements set forth in subdivision (e) of Section 54953 of the California Government Code.

Motion made by Burkard, second by Morrison, to approve the findings. Verbal roll call: Commissioner Morrison – yay; Commissioner McQuilkin – yay; Commissioner Wells – yay; Burkard – yay; Commissioner Walsh – yay; All in favor, no abstentions; findings approved 5-0.

5. Approval of the minutes of the January 26, 2022 special meeting and the March 29, 2022 regular meeting. Motion made by Wells, second by Walsh to approve the minutes of the January 26 and March 29 meetings. Verbal roll call: Commissioner Morrison – yay; Commissioner McQuilkin – yay; Commissioner Wells – yay; Burkard – yay; Commissioner Walsh – yay; All in favor, no abstentions; minutes approved 5-0.

6. Monthly financial/budget report.

FY 22-23 Budget Calendar update:

Ms. Vennos reported that third quarter review is coming up Tuesday, May 10th, budget and spending is on track, and staff has no adjustments or requests. Budget planning for FY 22-23 due on May 6th. Staff will meet with CAO to discuss department's budget units (tourism, economic development, fish enhancement, community support). Requesting \$300,000 for tourism budget as TOT is projected to be about 10% higher than expected this year. Requesting \$80,000 for economic development budget, used to promote and support small businesses. Same requests for \$100,000 for fish stocking investment in the fish enhancement. We receive a portion of the fines that CDFW collects each year, current balance of the fish and game fine fund is about \$65,000. Fish and Wildlife Commission typically requested and used those funds, but since the Commission was dissolved, will be working on creating a grant program like the community support grant programs. Possibly requesting more budget for a part-time assistance. Ms. Vennos will follow up and send a link to the strategic plan update. The preliminary budget adoption is scheduled for June 21st, with any modifications considered on July 8th, and the final budget adoption on August 16th.

7. <u>Economic Development and Tourism report – information on current or emerging issues, including but not limited to:</u>

- Update on the Community Economic Resilience Fund (CERF) program
 Mr. Simpson noted the State is still working on revisions to the program. Informational meeting tomorrow, but exact parameters have not been released.
- Report on regional Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) program sponsored by the Rural County Representatives of California (RCRC).
 RCRC has applied for EDA money to create the CEDS, waiting for approval.
- c. Report on the regional Business Resource Center facility and grant, administered and coordinated by Inyo County
 - Ms. Vennos has continued to attend meetings.
- d. Update regarding Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) CARES Act CV1, 2, 3 for Microenterprise Financial Assistance Program for small businesses

 Mr. Simpson noted that all money will be expended with the few businesses left in the queue.

8. <u>Film Commission update on film production in Mono County, permitting issues, and other film-related updates – Alicia Vennos/Steve Morrison</u>

Ms. Vennos seeing an uptick in inquiries. Commission Morrison was busy in March but slowing down in April and May. Continuing to explore partnership with USFS where the county can assist with the film permit application intake process to help speed up the turnaround time.

- 9. Fisheries Report, including California Department of Fish & Wildlife news release regarding outbreak of Lactococcus petauri bacterial infection at two CADFW hatcheries (https://wildlife.ca.gov/News/new-bacterial-outbreak-confirmed-at-two-eastern-sierra-fish-hatcheries) Jeff Simpson Mr. Simpson reported on the CDFW's announcement. The Mono County stocking program has started, all main and accessible bodies of water have been stocked. Others will be when accessible. Stocking ends mid-July because of temperatures and water levels. The Mono County Fishing Map has been updated, with changes to the sustainable fishing section, promoting catch and release and leave no trace/mountain manners. Tangle-free waters Mammoth Lakes Recreation has installed PVC tubes to recycle fishing line (only, no other trash). QR code will geolocate you and give regulations for your current location. Visit Bishop hosted fishing summit marina operators, CDFW, etc. to talk about what's new for fishing this season.
- 10. <u>Moratorium on New Short-Term & Transient Rentals (STR) –</u> Report and discussion on proposed ordinance to temporarily suspend County permitting of new short-term or transient rental operations of residential units. Alicia Vennos / Community Development staff

<u>Action</u>: Discuss issue and potentially draft letter to the Board of Supervisors (BOS) expressing concerns/ questions/recommendations to submit for Board consideration prior to the STR Moratorium public hearing at the May 3, 2022 BOS meeting.

Bentley Regehr presented the proposed moratorium and the options that the Board of Supervisors will consider at their May 3rd meeting. Staff and the Commissioners discussed the options and agreed to draft a letter to the BOS explaining the mortarium should not be County-wide and should instead be focused on communities where STRs are more of an issue.

Great Beyond brand video, and tradeshows/conferences.

CA Great Beyond promotional video is almost complete, and will advertised on TV. BLM will work with us on revising the Backroad Tours Guide.
