THE POSITION

he successful candidate is a team-oriented paramedic/firefighter able to demonstrate the ability to function well as a member of an EMS team. This individual must be capable of working in an environment that is ethnically & culturally diverse. The ideal candidate must demonstrate superior knowledge of local, county & state paramedic protocols. Under general supervision, essential functions include but are not limited to:

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Duties include but are not limited to the following:

- Working at assigned station with one partner on a forty-eight-hour shift.
- Provide Basic Life Support and/or Advanced Life Support treatment to victims, in accordance with California State and ICEMA Region Paramedic Scope of Practice.
- Performs necessary medical treatment and assists in patient extrication from vehicles involved in traffic collisions or accidents, sometimes with assistance from other agencies; such as Mono County Sheriff's Office, Mono County Search and Rescue, local Fire Departments, United States Forest Service and others.
- Responds into the back county by foot, vehicle, helicopter or by whatever means necessary to render treatment.
- Operates rescue unit in presence of inclement weather, road closures and possible avalanche danger.
- Complete run paperwork in a timely and accurate manner.

Secondary Duties:

- Perform over-the-side rescues of victims as trained.
- Responds to the fire ground to treat victims of fire, explosions, or building collapse. Assists with emergency incident rehabilitation on the fire

ground as assigned.

Perform Ice Rescue of victims as trained.

QUALIFICATIONS

Paramedic I/II would possess the following:

- Paramedic Scope of Practice as defined and required by the State of California
- BLS and ALS protocols as required by the local certifying agency (ICEMA)
- > Cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- > Emergency medical techniques

- Recordkeeping procedures and methods of documentation.
